

FULBRIGHT GRANTS



for Graduate Study in the United States, Academic Year 2011-12

Grants are available for graduate study at universities in the United States for master's, doctoral or non-degree programs for the 2011-2012 academic year. Grantees will receive cash awards of SEK 25,000 - 200,000 from the Fulbright Commission and will be eligible for additional financial aid from U.S. universities.

The Fulbright Commission will apply for admission and for supplementary financial assistance at the grantees' preferred U.S. universities. Awards from institutions in the United States vary in amount, depending upon a grantee's qualifications and field of study, and there is no guarantee that every grantee will succeed in winning additional financial aid nor that all costs for the academic year will be covered.

Eligibility requirements:

- Excellent academic record
- Swedish or E.U. university degree completed by the summer of 2011
- Fluency in English
- Swedish citizenship

Applications will be accepted in all fields, except medicine (not including Public Health or medical research), dentistry, and veterinary medicine. Students who are already enrolled in a graduate program at a university in the U.S. are not eligible. Persons desiring or holding permanent residence in the United States, as well as persons with dual citizenship (Swedish and U.S.), are ineligible for a Fulbright grant.

Preference will be given to candidates who have not recently studied for an extended period of time at a university in the United States.

Application procedure:

All application materials must be received by the deadline date of **April 26, 2010**. Selected finalists will be interviewed in Stockholm, June 2010. Selected grantees will be required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and depending on the field of study, either the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT). Tests will be administered during the fall 2010. Grantees in law will be required take the TOEFL test only. Test costs for finalists will be covered by the Fulbright Commission.
