

/ GRANTS FOR Transatlantic Research

The Fulbright Schuman Program, administered by the Fulbright Commission in Brussels awards scholarships to European citizens for research in the United States on a topic that is relevant to US-EU relations, EU affairs/policy, or EU institutions. The program is jointly financed by the U.S. State Department and the Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture (DG.EAC) of the European Commission.

Eligibility

- Hold citizenship in an EU Member State
- Demonstrate proficiency in English
- Hold a minimum of a bachelor's degree (for students), or a minimum of a doctoral degree (for scholars) by departure
- Demonstrate academic excellence or an outstanding personal or professional background
- Academic or professional experience of 3+ months in two or more EU Member States is recommended

Benefits

- Scholarship of up to €2,000 per month (students) or €3,000 per month (scholars) for maximum 9 months
- J-1 visa sponsorship
- Pre-departure support
- Travel stipend of €2,000
- Health benefit plan
- In-country programming (e.g. orientations, seminars, local adviser)
- Prestigious title and access to alumni network
